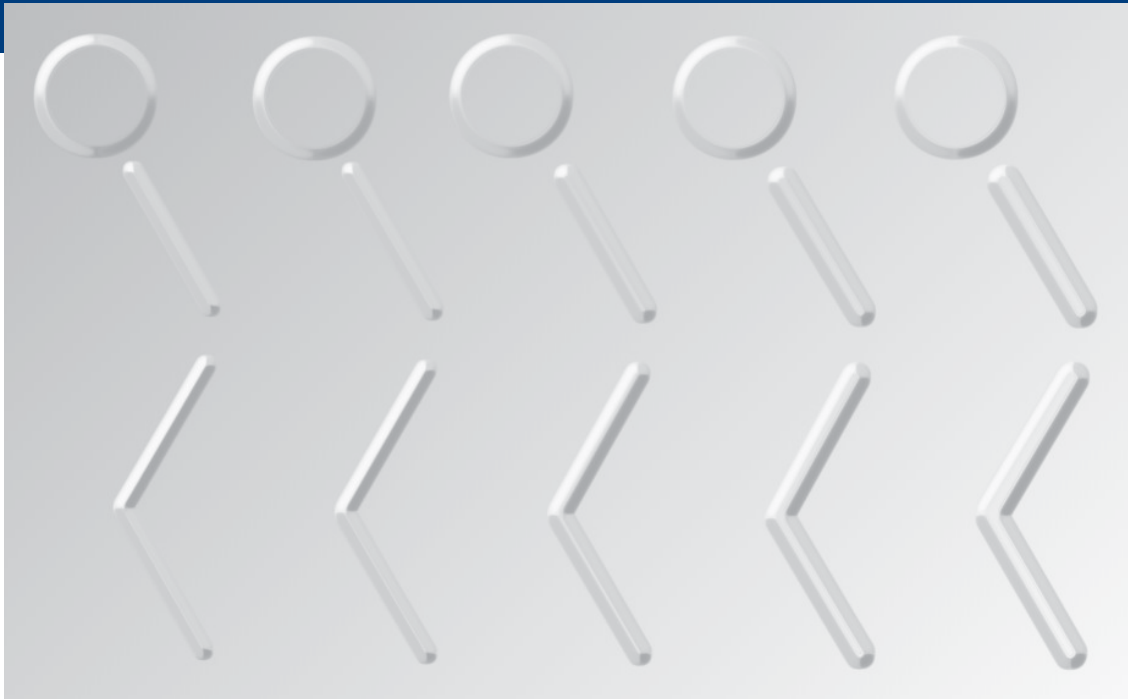




The Leeds course in Clinical Nutrition

Administrative Arrangements

Venue

The course will be held entirely at the University of Leeds, Woodhouse Lane, Leeds, LS2 9JT. Directions to the venue will be provided within the delegate joining instructions. Accommodation

The University of Leeds reserves the right to cancel or postpone the course, in which case fees will be refunded in full. After this date, 80% of the total fees payable will be charged for cancellations received less than 28 days before the course.
